

Sample Interview with author Elloise Bennett

Elloise Bennett, author of the debut novel, "My Father's Husband," talks about her writing.

Q: Welcome Elloise, and thank you for taking the time to sit down for this interview. Let's jump right in. You write that this book is based on your life. Is it fiction or is it real?

EB: They say art imitates life, or something of that nature. But the truth is, sometimes life inspires art. This book is a blending of life and inspiration. Some things happened exactly as written. Others I had to simplify and fictionalize to not bore my poor reader with the minutia of life. All character names have been changed. I'd classify this as more memoirialized fiction since the story is heavily based on my own experiences. Definitely on my emotions.

Q: A large part of the novel is about your relationship with your father. Has he read the book? How did he feel about it?

EB: Yes, a big part of the novel is about rekindling my relationship with the man whom I see as my father. And yes, he did read the book. Although not until it was published. I think I was nervous to know what he would think until after it was a *fait accompli*. My understanding is that he liked it very much – although we may differ on which parts are our favorites!

Q: Is your book about gay marriage? Is this a political take?

EB: Yes and no. There is gay marriage in the book. And I do state in the book what I think and feel. But this book is about more than that. As most of life is. You cannot simply it to just one dynamic. Writing this book was a personal journey and so it's a personal stance. It's not political.

Q: What inspired the writing of the novel?

EB: I've always been a writer. All my computer archives are full of half-written stories. I always wanted to write a novel. And finally I gave myself the gift of some time to do it. I hauled up in a cabin in the Belgium Ardennes forest for a week and started writing. Before I knew it, I had five chapters done. It was a very personal writing process too — a cathartic journey. I wrote really more at the start to process something I was experiencing. And then it became more than that.

Q: There are aspects of the book that are extremely personal. How do you deal with knowing your readers are turning those specific pages?

EB: That was actually something I had to think about carefully. I was an educator, how would I feel if especially former students read some of the sections, or even all of the book. And again, not all of it is actual true to life. But at one point I realized I wanted to take my read on an emotional journey with me and for some of that journey I had to open up some pretty raw spaces of my own self. And I am glad I did, everyone's reaction has been such that it made me feel good to trust my readers. I learned on my blog also, that if I am real... and even sometimes raw with what I feel, then my readers relate and react positively.

Q: That's right. You also publish a blog. Is it about the book?

EB: Not about, but thanks to some of the events of the book. I left my career in the USA and moved to Europe, and had more time to write and travel. For the first time in my life I was doing things for myself, which was so great. So I started blogging about finding the joy of travel, but also about finding myself. Hence the title of the blog, Found Travel. And it's been a great resource also to try out writing styles, techniques, even material.

Q: We also heard that your father was involved in designing the book cover. Is that true?

EB: Actually, it's all his design. He's an incredible artist, and since his husband is involved in the title, I thought it would be fun if he is involved in the cover! So he created and designed it for me.

Q: Is there a follow up book? Your fans want to know what's next for Celia.

EB: Of course there is! It's in progress right now. Celia will for sure show up on more pages and under another title. She's got lots to learn and experience and share.
